## Lafourche Parish Communications District 2020 Proposed Amended Budget Message

#### Members of the Board of Commissioners:

I have submitted to you the proposed Amended Budget for the calendar year 2020. The budget is fiscally conservative and expenditures are budgeted within anticipated revenues. The budget document attached includes anticipated revenues and expenditures, on a modified accrual basis. There are certain significant aspects of the budget, which are detailed below.

#### Revenues

Revenues are received from money assessed telephone wireline and wireless subscribers in Lafourche Parish and pre-paid wireless submitted to the Louisiana Department of Revenue and disbursed to the parishes quarterly based on population. In April 2016 the board approved the increase on landline service charge to 5% on residential which is \$ 1.25 and 3.7% on business lines which is \$3.50. In the 2016 Regular Session HB 805 Act 665 and HB 678 Act 590 were approved to increase post paid wireless to \$1.25 and prepaid wireless from 2 % to 4%.

#### **Expenditures**

Expected expenditures are mainly made up of telephone service charges, payroll and building maintenance This is the twenty six year we experience a payroll and it's expenses.

Normal administrative and operations cost make up the remainder of the expenses.

#### Summary

The budget is presented in a manner designed to assist in formulating a financial plan for the coming year. The ending fund balance consists of individual funds set aside for equipment upgrades.

I have submitted to you the proposed Amended Budget for the calendar year 2021. The budget is fiscally conservative and expenditures are budgeted within anticipated revenues. The budget document attached includes anticipated revenues and expenditures, on a modified accrual basis. There are certain significant aspects of the budget, which are detailed below.

#### Revenues

Revenues are received from money assessed telephone wireline and wireless subscribers in Lafourche Parish and pre-paid wireless submitted to the Louisiana Department of Revenue and disbursed to the parishes quarterly based on population. In April 2016 the board approved the increase on landline service charge to 5% on residential which is \$ 1.25 and 3.7% on business lines which is \$3.50. In the 2016 Regular Session HB 805 Act 665 and HB 678 Act 590 were approved to increase post paid wireless to \$1.25 and prepaid wireless from 2 % to 4%.

#### **Expenditures**

Expected expenditures are mainly made up of telephone service charges, payroll and building maintenance This is the twenty seventh year we experience a payroll and it's expenses.

Normal administrative and operations cost make up the remainder of the expenses.

#### Summary

The budget is presented in a manner designed to assist in formulating a financial plan for the coming year. The ending fund balance consists of individual funds set aside for equipment upgrades.

#### BUDGETING

The administrator will annually submit a budget to the board of commissioners at the October meeting or the next scheduled meeting for review. The Budget will be published in the official journal "Daily Comet" and a public hearing will be scheduled before the December regular meeting. The proposed budget shall be adopted at the December meeting.

The budget is prepared by using estimated figures from the previous year expenses and revenue received.

The budget can be amended by the board of commissioners at any quarterly or special meeting at which a quorum is present and voting.

The Board of Commissioners will be provided at all quarterly meetings a financial report budget vs actual along with other financial reports for review and approval under agenda item financial reports.

#### **BANKING**

#### **DEPOSITS & CASH RECEIPTS**

All checks received will be deposited into the LPCD Investment Account with Capital One Bank in a timely manner, if total received is \$10,000.00 or over it will be deposited the day of receipt.

Mail will be picked up at post office by one of the administrative staff members at least twice a week.

All mail is opened by and administrative staff member and stamped received. It is then given to the administrator and either the administrator or administrative assistant will enter into Quick Books.

Deposits will be made by one of the administrative staff and the deposit slip will be initialed.

Cash receipts are mailed monthly, quarterly or annually depending on the telephone company or wireless provider. The Louisiana Department of Revenue does automatic deposit quarterly for prepaid wireless.

All deposits and cash receipts are kept and filed in the cash receipts binder.

#### **TRANSFERS**

All transfers will be done by the administrator and the administrative assistant through an online account. Either the administrator or the administrative assistant will enter the transfer online and the other will approve the transfer. Transfers will then be entered into the accounting program by the administrator or administrative assistant.

All revenue is deposited into the investment account. The amount needed for operations will be transferred from the investment account into the operating account, all other transfer will be from the operating account into other accounts. Ex. Payroll, bond sinking

#### **RECONCILIATIONS**

Monthly bank statements will be opened and reviewed by a board member or administrative staff and will be initialed by the reviewer. The administrator or administrative assistant will reconcile the account. A copy of the reconciliation form will be attached to the statement. The secretary/treasurer will review the reconciliation upon completion. After review, it will be filed in the bank statement binder.

#### **PURCHASING**

Louisiana Public Bid Law will be followed for all major purchases and approved by the Communications District Board. Operations purchases will be made locally if available and cost effective.

Purchasing of items utilized for daily operations of the district is overseen by the administrator and/or pre-approved by the administrator. Large items that exceed \$5000 per purchase will be presented to the Board for approval prior to purchase being completed.

- 1. Purchases are initiated by the Administrator
- 2. The Administrator approves all vendors utilized by the district.
- 3. The Administrative assistant will issue purchase order and document in purchase order binder a copy of the check and invoice will also be attached.
- 4. Bid law compliance is adhered to by the Communications District for all purchases and/or expenditures that are regulated and exceed the dollar amount for allowed items per the state bid law.
- 5. All documentation for bids and price quotes are maintained within the districts files per the State Public Records law requirements.

#### **DISBURSEMENTS**

Invoices are paid upon receipt and approved by the Communications District Board at the quarterly board meetings. All reoccurring invoices are paid monthly.

Invoices are received and reviewed by an administrative staff member hen given to Administrator or Administrative Assistant for payment. Checks will then be given to another administrative staff member for payment of invoice.

The check stub is then attached to the invoice and filed in the invoice for payment binders. The board is provided with reports of invoices paid.

#### PAYROLL/PERSONNEL

#### **PAYROLL PROCESSING**

Employees are paid biweekly. Payroll is processed by the Administrator and/or the Administrative Assistant.

#### TIME SHEETS

Telecommunicator's timesheets are kept by the operations supervisor. Administrative staff keeps their own time sheets. Salaried employees are not required to keep a time sheet. Time sheets are then presented to the employees for their review and signature. The times sheets are then given to the administrative assistant for review and then payroll is processed by the administrator or the administrative assistant.

#### CONTRACTING

All new contracts will be approved by the board at a quarterly or special meeting.

#### **CREDIT CARDS/DEBIT CARDS/Fuel Cards/P-Cards**

Employees will be reimbursed for any purchases made for the District upon providing the receipts. The LPCD credit card is left in the Administrators drawer. Any purchases from Walmart is given a PO number and administrative staff will make purchase. Employees use personal credit cards if needed and are reimbursed.

#### TRAVEL

Travel expenses (registration, room, mileage or airfare will be paid by the Lafourche Communications District or reimbursed to employee upon providing the receipts. Louisiana State Travel Guide will be used for mileage rate reimbursement and per diem.

- 1. Expenses that will be covered with prior approval are transportation, lodging, registration and meals.
- 2. Transportation will be covered based on the location and distance. If air fare is required expenses will be within reason of the basic passenger fare. If an employee or board member choses to drive verses flying they may receive reimbursement equal to the dollar value of the air fare amount. If travel location is found to be more feasible to drive, mileage will be paid based upon the current rate in the Louisiana State Travel Guide allowance upon utilizing person vehicle.
  Meal per diem will be advanced prior to travel. Such per diems will be based on the Louisiana State Travel Guide allowable amount for the destination of the event

**Lodging** - will be covered by one of two means, (1) advance funds on total expense of hotel stay or reimbursed upon obtaining the receipts **Registration** – expenses for registration will be covered prior to attendance if possible.

- 3. Person's traveling will be responsible for submitting receipts for lodging immediately following event.
- 4. Travel for employees is approved by the Administrator based on each request or event that is directly related to communications operations and or training and if funds are available in the budget.

#### **ETHICS**

Employees and Board of Commissioners will comply with all Louisiana State Ethics Laws.

All employee's and members of the board must annually complete the Louisiana ethics training seminar by means of in person class or online webinar.

- 1. Prohibition The Communications District adheres to rulings as defined in the state statute.
- 2. Action the Communications District will notify legal counsel Lafourche Parish District Attorney's office if ethic violation takes place
- 3. System violations are monitored by the Administrator and Board.
- 4. Requirement The Communications District personnel and board of officers complete the online ethics training seminar providing verification copies of certificates of completion.

Vertiv Corporation is herein referred to as the "Seller" and the customer or person or entity purchasing goods and/or services ("Goods") and/or parts required for services ("Parts") or licensing software and/or firmware, which are preloaded, or to be used with Goods ("Software") from Seller is referred to as the "Buyer." These Terms and Conditions, any price list or schedule, quotation, acknowledgment, Seller's scope or statement of work, or invoice from Seller relevant to the sale of the Goods, Parts and licensing of Software by Seller, and all associated terms, conditions and documents incorporated by specific reference herein or therein, constitute the complete and exclusive statement of the terms of the agreement ("Agreement") governing the sale of Goods, Parts, and/or license of Software by Seller to Buyer. - 3. TERMS OF PAYMENT: Unless otherwise specified by Seller, terms are net thirty (30) days from date of Seller's invoice in U.S. currency. Seller reserves the right to make partial shipments. Seller, at its option, shall not be bound to tender delivery of any Goods, Parts, and/or Software for which Buyer has not provided shipping instructions and other required information. If the shipment or performance of the Goods, Parts, and/or Software is postponed or delayed by Buyer for any reason, Buyer agrees to reimburse Seller for any and all storage costs and other additional expenses resulting therefrom. Seller's warranty as to utility patents only applies to infringement arising solely out of Buyer's operation according to Seller's specifications and instructions of such Goods and/or Software. In the event (i) such Goods and/or Software are held to infringe such a U.S. patent or copyright in such suit, and the use of such Goods and/or Software is enjoined, or (ii) a compromise or settlement is made by Seller, Seller shall have the right, at its option and expense, to procure for Buyer the right to continue using such Goods and/or Software, or replace them with non-infringing Goods and/or Software, or modify same to become non-infringing, or grant Buyer a credit for the depreciated value of such Goods and/or Software and accept return of them. In the event of the foregoing, Seller may also, at its option, cancel the agreement as to future deliveries of such Goods and/or Software, without liability. EXCUSE OF PERFORMANCE: Seller shall not be liable for delays in performance or for non-performance due to acts of God, acts of Buyer, war, epidemic, fire, flood, weather, sabotage, strikes or labor disputes; civil disturbances or riots; governmental requests, restrictions, allocations, laws, regulations, orders or actions; unavailability of or delays in transportation; default of suppliers; or unforeseen circumstances, acts or omissions of Buyer, or any events or causes beyond Seller's reasonable control. Deliveries or other performance may be suspended for an appropriate period of time or canceled by Seller upon notice to Buyer in the event of any of the foregoing, but the balance of this Agreement shall otherwise remain unaffected as a result of the foregoing. - 17. ### Families First Coronavirus Response Act Policy

The Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) may require employers to provide eligible employees with: public health emergency leave (PHEL) pursuant to the Emergency Family and Medical Leave Expansion Act (EFMLEA); and/or emergency paid sick leave (EPSL) pursuant to the Emergency Paid Sick Leave Act (EPSLA).

## Emergency Paid Sick Leave (EPSL) Eligibility

Lafourche Parish Communications District is using the U.S. Department of Labor Guidelines to determine who is eligible for EPSL. Here an excerpt from the U.S. Department of Labor:

The District will use this language to apply the litmus test to determine eligibility based on each situation:

- Did an administrator, administrative assistant or operations supervisor send an employee home?
- Is there a positive COVID test?
- Did a doctor require an employee to be sent home?

If the answer to any of these questions yes, then the employee is eligible for EPSL. The U.S. DOL does allow the district to exclude emergency responders and this will be addressed on a case by case basis. Here is a U.S. DOL website that simplifies the process:

### Amount of EPSL

Full-time employees will be granted 80 of EPSL (or the equivalent of the average number of hours over two (2) weeks for part-time employees) available for immediate use. EPSL is provided in addition to any other paid time off or paid leave provided by the District.

### Public Health Emergency Leave (PHEL) - Addendum to FMLA policy

This policy supplements the District's federal Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) policy and provides employees information concerning PHEL entitlements and obligations that differ from the general FMLA entitlements and obligations that are set forth elsewhere in the District's FMLA policy. The District will apply its general FMLA policy and procedures in accordance with regulations issued under the FFCRA.

### Eligibility Requirements

For purposes of PHEL only, employees are eligible if they have worked for the District for at least 30 calendar days, except that the District may elect to exclude employees who are health emergency responders.

### **Basic Leave Entitlement**

The FMLA provides eligible employees up to 12 workweeks of unpaid leave for certain family and medical reasons during a 12-month period. The EFMLEA expands the FMLA to provide PHEL-eligible employees who are unable to work or telework with up to 12 workweeks of PHEL due to a need to care for the employee's son or daughter (under 18 years of age) if the child's elementary or secondary school or place of care has been closed, or the child care provider of the child is unavailable due to a public health emergency. A "child care provider" means a provider who receives compensation for providing child care services on a regular basis. A "public health emergency" means an emergency with respect to COVID-19 declared by a federal, state or local authority.

### **Vacation Time**

All vacation that was not used between January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 can either be carried over to the 2021 Calendar year or be paid in full on their December 2020 check.

### Return to Work/Fitness for Duty Medical Certifications

Unless notified that providing such certifications is not necessary, employees returning to work due to a positive Covid-19 test must provide the District with medical certification confirming they are able to return to work and the employees' ability to perform the essential functions of the employees' position, with or without reasonable accommodation. The District may delay and/or deny job restoration until employees provide return to work/fitness for duty certifications.

Employees that have been advised by a healthcare provider to self-quarantine due to concerns related to Covid-19, caring for an individual with Covid-19 or caring for someone who is self-quarantine due to concerns related to Covid-19 shall provide a medical certification confirming they are able to return to work.

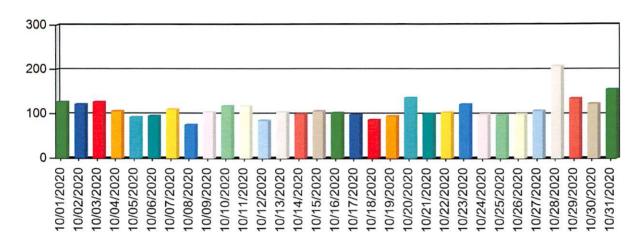

I have received the information for the meeting this week. I have some concerns that I want to relay to the board in reference to the request by Nicholls to change the street names:

The City of Thibodaux has a process for street name changes. It starts with a request for a review by a group or person to change a street name as a submission to a panel of civic leaders in the City. The panel deliberates the name change and makes a decision to either deny the change or approve it to move to the next step. If approved the name change request moves to the City Council and progresses through the normal legislative process. This includes an ordinance introduction, public hearing and final vote over the course of two council meetings. If approved it would move to the Mayor to either sign or veto the ordinance. If signed the legislation would form the basis of a request by the City of Thibodaux to the Lafourche Parish Communications District, to change the name of a street. Multiple streets would follow the same process, yet the timeframe and effort would be more extensive due to all of the supporting legal elements that are required for these type of changes.

The Mayor asked me to conduct an strategic analysis of the Nicholls request to change the street names. We have confirmed, that Nicholls does have the authority to submit a request to change street names on campus without passing through the City of Thibodaux process. This Nicholls request is separate of the City of Thibodaux process for actions of this type. The attached analysis for the City contains information that I will use to form my vote on Thursday. This analysis reflects my viewpoint as a voting board member.

Mayor Eschete's official position is Nicholls has the right to follow the Lafourche Parish Communication District process as an individual entity. At this point, the City of Thibodaux will not be submitting a supporting request to change any street names that are off campus.

Please include this in the packet to the board. I will speak to the board about this subject at the meeting. Thanks

Summary: The City of Thibodaux uses a deliberate process to review events and develop strategic action plans. Strategic leadership applied to situational events involves the use of five key steps: Task- What is this situation? Purpose- What is the center of gravity of the issue? Issue- What strategic effects does this situation impact or cause? Discussion- What are the facts of this situation as well as the second and third order effects of this situation? Recommendation- What is the recommended action?

Task: The City of Thibodaux Special Projects (SP) Coordinator/Emergency Preparedness Director will complete a strategic action plan to analyze the Nicholls State University intent to change street names on campus. The SP Coordinator will complete this task in support of duties as a Lafourche Parish Communications District (LPCD) Board Commissioner.

**Purpose:** The intent is to develop all of the information, review the second and third order effects, determine the impact to the City of Thibodaux and use the information as the foundation for one LPCD vote on the issue.

**Issue:** Nicholls State University has submitted a request for a change to the street names on campus. This decision has the potential to impact the City of Thibodaux.

Discussion: Nicholls State University is geographically located in the City of Thibodaux limits as well as in the Lafourche Parish boundary. The City of Thibodaux has partnered with Nicholls to facilitate Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development (DOTD) road improvement projects on campus. The two most recent projects are the Glenwood Dr. improvements and the Audubon Ave. round-about installation. The LPCD manages all 911 activities for the City of Thibodaux, which includes Nicholls. The LPCD is involved in the public safety partnership with the City of Thibodaux and Nicholls as individual entities. Each organization has an individual governing body and process for decision making. Nicholls has established the intent to change street names independently of the City of Thibodaux, submitting a request to the LPCD for approval. The City of Thibodaux partnership with Nicholls for Louisiana DOTD work is not a factor in this process, yet there are second and third order effects of this decision. Nicholls is not just an entity in the City of Thibodaux, Nicholls is the "heartbeat" of the City of Thibodaux. The City of Thibodaux makes strategic decisions with Nicholls as one of the key reciprocating elements. All operations are interlinked and form the nucleus of the parish seat of Lafourche parish, the center of the tri-parish area and the pearl of the Bayou Region within the state of Louisiana. Decisions by the City of Thibodaux impact Nicholls and vice versa. A few key examples are the Nicholls to Downtown Bike Path project, Joint Drive-Thru Community Christmas Display and the ongoing **Emergency Preparedness Partnership.** 

Nicholls has indicated the intent to change the street names on campus is due to the affiliation with plantation names and the negative connotation of plantations in the historical slavery era. The precedent of this decision has the potential to impact the City of Thibodaux. There are 35 streets in the City of Thibodaux that are affiliated with or have names that resemble plantations or plantation houses.

The street name and plantation locations are: Acadia (3)- Thibodaux, Allendale- West Baton Rouge, Alice (2)- St. Mary, Ashland- Ascension, Audubon- East Baton Rouge, Bocage- Ascension, Calumet- St. Mary, Chenet- St. James, Coulon (2)- Lafourche, Destrehan- St. Charles, Ducros- Terrebonne, Godchaux- St. John, Hermitage- Ascension, Homestead- Iberville, Houmas- Terrebonne, Laura- St. James, Magnolia- Terrebonne, Melrose- Natchoches, Oakley- West Feliciana, Nicholls (2)- Thibodaux, Ormonde- St. Charles, Plantation, Ridgefield (2)- Thibodaux, Rienzi- Thibodaux, Rosedown- West Feliciana, St. Emma- Assumption, St. Joseph- St. James, St. Louis- Ibberville and St. Michael- St. James.

A check of the City utility billing system indicates there are 6847 structures with City services. There are 1533 structures on the 35 streets with plantation affiliated names. This represents 22% of the City structures on these 35 streets. Each structure may have multiple residents as well as businesses or organizations. An analysis of the occupational licensing proved too vast. There are 5000 businesses licensed within the City of Thibodaux with 850 of those physically located in the city limits. In addition, the 2020 U.S. Census Bureau data has not been published (2010 USCB data- City of Thibodaux Population- 14,567). Based on these factors, this analysis used the utility billing information of 22% as the baseline. 22% means that over 1500 structures, 3200 residents and 185 resident businesses would be impacted if the Nicholls decision was applied as precedent to the City of Thibodaux. All of these entities would be required to change addresses, voter registration, banking account information, direct deposit notices, department of motor vehicles information and employer information as some key examples.

The cost to the City for 22% changes in street signs would be significant. The cost for administrative actions of the City for relabeling utility accounts and business licensing would add to the cost. The personnel labor cost to follow the LPCD board process for street name changes adds another layer of financial obligation. The total costs would also reflect a major City of Thibodaux employee manpower endeavor if the Nicholls decision was applied as precedent to the City of Thibodaux.

Another key second and third order effect is the public safety issue. The LPCD is a public entity and cannot share information changes with private corporations. New Nicholls campus street names will not be current in GPS systems, meaning companies like Google, Garmin and GIS etc. must refresh the data on their own timetable. The average update to reach the commercial market takes 3-5 years. EMS personnel regularly contract personnel from other areas. Volunteer fireman come from all areas of the region. State and federal law enforcement based out metropolitan Louisiana areas perform law enforcement here. National Guardsmen and women deploy to Louisiana from various states, as we have seen this past hurricane season. All of these entities use GPS data when working regionally. The potential exists for coordination issues until the GPS systems refresh with current information.

Recommendation: Based on all of the factors, I cannot endorse a change to the names of the streets on Nicholls. In the system of government, precedent is a major factor. It governs court actions, zoning restrictions, procedural rules, operations, regulatory laws and ordinances. In addition to precedent, the consideration of cost is paramount. The cost to a change of street names in the City of Thibodaux would force a reduction in city services like parks and recreation, social programs, infrastructure improvement and public safety. The center of gravity is at the core of this analysis. The amount of effort that would be placed on the City of Thibodaux residents, businesses and organizations for a city wide change of this magnitude is prohibitive in itself. The most significant aspect was referenced earlier in this analysis:

Nicholls is not just an entity in the City of Thibodaux, Nicholls is the "heartbeat" of the City of Thibodaux. The City of Thibodaux makes strategic decisions with Nicholls as one of the key reciprocating elements. All operations are interlinked and form the nucleus of the parish seat of Lafourche parish, the center of the triparish area and the pearl of the Bayou Region within the state of Louisiana. Decisions by the City of Thibodaux impact Nicholls and vice versa.
