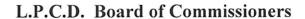

ADMINISTRATOR

The Administrator is appointed by the Board of Commissioners to carry out the administrative duties of the District. The Administrator reports to the Board and is vested with sufficient authority to oversee and implement policy and procedures as directed by the Board.

The Administrator's term of office shall be continuous and may be terminated by the appointing authority for good cause and subsequent to formal and open hearing on specific charges, if requested.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Represent the District as liason with Parish Administration, Municipalities, and Emergency Service Providers, as directed by the Board
- . Coordinate the preparation of the annual budget with Budget Committee members
- . Monitor maintenance contract performance
- . Develop and implement programs of community relations and education
- Perform all administrative, clerical and bookkeeping duties including, but not limited to:
 - . Administrative and financial recordkeeping
 - . Prepare monthly board meeting agenda and reports as directed
 - . 911 Inquiry sheets processing and resolution
 - . Report equipment problems to respective agencies
 - . Provide checklist of periodic testing and monitoring of PSAP equipment
 - . Monthly income and expese reports
 - . Maintain the Standard Operating Procedures Manuals for E911 Administration and Operations
 - . Prepare proposed modifications to Policies and Procedures for presentation to Board
 - . Provide telephone related information to South Central Bell and Latelco
 - . Coordinate the annual audit review and provide all necessary information to the
 - audit staff in a timely manner, under the direction of the Secretary-Treasurer
 - . Publication of Board meeting minutes in the Official Journal
 - . Insure uniform address verification practices
 - . Coordinate periodic public awareness campaigns

ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT

The Administrative Assistant is responsible for supervision of the daily operations of the 911 Center, including shift personnel and equipment and assisting Administrator with any other duties required. The Administrative Assistant will oversee the Operations Supervisor and Public Educuation.

Duties include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Provides supervisory guidance and assistance to personnel by assigning duty areas, reviewing written reports, providing technical assistance, keeping personnel records, resolving employee complaints and grievances and recommending and administering discipline when required.
- 2. Provides interface with all emergency service agencies while on duty
- 3. Notifies equipment repair personnel or Administrator of malfunctioning equipment; supervises the general care and use of equipment; conducts or provides for testing as necessary to assure that equipment is in proper operating condition
- 4. Assists in the maintenance of all records, reports, maps and documents necessary to the operation of the 911 Center.
- 5. Provides input for budgetary preparation such as recommendations for operations needs and training programs.
- 6. Completes any special projects assigned by the Administrator such as researching new equipment or procedures, reviewing ongoing operations and making recommendations for changes or improvements, or any related assignments
- 7. Maintain up to date equipment mainenance logs
- 8. MSAG Maintenance, Street Resolutions and required paperwork
- 9. Prepare quarterly board meeting packets and minutes of board meetings, recording secretary of all LPCD meetings
- 10. Provide backup to 911 operators and Administrator as needed

OPERATIONS SUPERVISOR

The Operations Supervisor is responsible for the supervision of daily operations of the 911 center, including shift personnel and equiptment.

- 1. Responsible for scheduling and ensuring adequate staffing levels (including time off for vacations, holidays, sick leave, etc), directly oversing the training of 911 telecommunicators, and evaluating the work performace of all subordinates.
- 2. Responsible for the proper monitoring of all Emergency 911 calls entering into the PSAP, including those calls received from the hearing impaired and Text-2-911 calls and any future technology
- 3. Is the immediate supervisor of the Telecommunicators and is responsible for the proper monitoring of the job performace exhibited by each individual employed therein. The Operations Supervisor will act in such a manner to direct inform support and maintain accuracy of all work and data collected by such employees and report in writing any achievements and/or problematic occurences which may result therof to the Administrative Assistant.
- 4. Must be able to perform all duties of a Telecommunicator and future emergency dispatching, and perform the duties of and act in the manner of a professional supervisor.
- 5. Resposible for exercising independent judgement in accordance with established Policy and Procedures
- 6. Responsible for assisting in the corrective measures required pertaining to Public Service Answering Point (PSAP) Inquiry Reports in a timely manner along with the Administrative Assistant.
- 7. May be required to attend District Board meetings and/or other meetings/functions as a representative of the District during or after normal business hours.
- 8. Monitors supplies and maintains sufficient supply of items on hand for daily operations.

911 TELECOMMUNICATOR

The 911 Telecommunicator performs responsible communications work in the operation of the telecommunications equipment in the 911 Center. Work involves the operation of the PSAP emergency telephone system. 911 Telecommunicators are responsible for answering telephone calls from the public and transferring the call to the proper emergency agency and performing related recordkeeping tasks. 911 Telecommunicators exercise independent judgement in accordance with established departmental rules and regulations. Work is reviewed through reports, conferences, and personal observations of goals and objectives attained. Performs other work as required.

Duties include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Monitors and receives all 911 phone calls for emergency services coming into the PSAP
- 2. Determines the nature of the call
- 3. Performs address verification
- 4. Transfers calls and/or notifies all appropriate emergency responding agencies for caller interrogation and dispatch of units
- 5. Maintains records of calls and PSAP activity and prepares required reports
- 6. Maintains proper housekeeping of work areas
- 7. Any other duties as needed directed by any Supervisor or Administration

Any District staff requested to participate in public education events will be compensated normal hourly rate. At times employee's may be requested to attend such events on off-shift days, holidays, and/or after normal work hours. Overtime and holiday pay will occur when applicable.

All District employee's must be aware that they represent the District in every aspect during public education sessions and will be scrutinized by the general public. Staff are expected to conduct themselves with a high degree of morality and ethical aptitude during any event where public is present.

PUBLIC EDUCATION

The Lafourche Parish Communications District/E-911 System will provide a means to educate and inform the citizenry of Lafourche Parish regarding various aspects of the affairs of the District, including but not limited to: History behind 9-1-1; How to use 9-1-1; what does Lafourche 9-1-1 offer/provide to the public; statistics regarding 9-1-1 call taking; future of our nation's, and our local 9-1-1 system. This position maybe a full or part time position depending on the needs of the District.

Duties include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Must present all requests for public education to the Administrative Assistant and must be accompanied by date, time, location, individual and/or entity making request and purpose of request. To better identify the target audience, primary purpose of the facility and age of attendees may also be a factor which will be used to determine the program to be provided.
- 2. Must be able to perform all duties of a Telecommunicator and future emergency dispatching and provide backup in the Operations Center.

Any District staff requested to participate in public education events will be compensated normal hourly rate. At times employee's may be requested to attend such events on off-shift days, holidays, and/or after normal work hours. Overtime and holiday pay will occur when applicable.

3. Konnect Functional Block Diagram

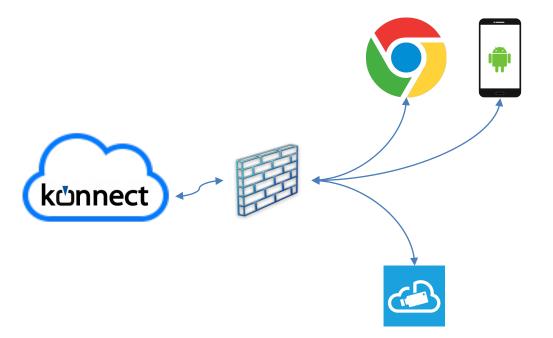
